

TALK TO A JUDGE

Read: 1 Corinthians 6:1-7

Have you ever heard two people argue? It's not much fun to listen to, is it? When one person is sure that he is right and tries to convince someone else who wants to do something another way...it causes an argument. Paul wrote the verses we just read to help some people that were arguing with each other. No matter how they tried, they just couldn't seem to get along.



Paul said they should be ashamed of themselves for arguing so much. That is not the way God wants Christians to act. Here is Paul's idea to help the arguers. He said that they should go to some other Christians and ask them to help solve the problem. Each person should tell what they believe is the right way to do something and then let their Christian friends decide which way is better. That sounds much better than just having two people yell and scream, doesn't it?

Life Application: If you get into an argument with your friend or brother or sister, who could you ask for help to solve the problem? If you go to a parent or teacher and tell them why you are arguing, they will probably be able to help you find an answer. It is much better than getting angry.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, I know that you are not pleased with me when I argue and fight. Please forgive me and help me find another Christian who can help stop the argument. Thank you for loving me. Amen
